## Presidents Report (Rachel Zimmerman)

- Board member change Joe Misner replaced John Larger as VP IT
- Band Ice Cream Social went well, concession tours/signups/leads found. There is ice cream left over for other programs to use.
- Bricks for wall in auditorium entry are at school, waiting for installation
- Budgets approved
- Website contract signed for the new website. The site will house online forms, all performing arts calendars, and more! Expecting about 6 weeks for completion.

- Scholarship called attorney to discuss how to handle overage in accounts and funding for needs-based students Orchestra and Band, add to Choir and theater.
- No trips this year
- Rewriting documents to cover scholarships in each performing arts area for an annual scholarship up to \$1000 each
- Spiritwear a vendor has been identified to use. We need to determine our list of items, send over logo, and find a parent to help with this.

# Treasurer Report - (Tlffany Tobin)

- Bank balance \$140,109.63
- Pending in paypal \$973
- Square It's difficult to determine which payments are concessions vs band. Tiffany is reconciling between 50-60K in deposits.
- All current bills are totaled and paid except cello and tuner. The pizza bill is not out yet.
- Tiffany is tracking expenses differently (including in/out expenses) to allocate budgets more efficiently
- Quickbooks reconciled

#### Concessions

Molly Farrell is tracking participation in concessions through signupgenius. (If there are any data points that directors would like to have in the future, let Molly know.)

- Spring 2024 breakdown (numbers are skewed due to tornado):
  - 331 students listed
    - 11% total of all students participated
    - 3% completed 2 shifts

- 59% crossovers
- 27% freshman / 27% sophomore / 27% juniors / 19% seniors class coverage
- 95 choir students 20% all but 2 in other areas
- 33 theater students 55%, all crossover
- 125 band students, 18% volunteered, half crossover
- 141 orchestra students, 4% volunteered, all but 1 crossover
- Discussion regarding concessions volunteers: Incentives for participation could include giving away tickets for performances. Friendly competitions between programs seems to gain signups. Continued sharing of performing arts budgets and the value of a volunteer shift (Friday night value = \$498) is important for parents to know. The FBPA cost per student is \$205 (based on 340 students and a budget of \$70,000). Training new volunteers is key to the success of concessions. It's hard to jump into a role on a busy Friday night. Suggest to new performing arts parents that they volunteer for a non-Friday night first. Important meetings that concessions should be discussed at include: Performing Arts parent night, Curriculum night, Freshman parent meeting; spring Band parent meeting. Continue to work with Mr. Rocco to increase communication with middle schools (Berkshire, Hyatts, Berlin).

## **Concessions: Shelly**

- Volunteer report:
- 290 volunteer shifts filled out of 340
- 140 email addresses available; 89 emails have signed up for 2+ shifts
- Prall/Shumaker families have taken 8 shifts each
- Overall:
  - 2 shift commitment completed by:
    - 57% band 57% choir
- Directors direct communication to families is working to gain volunteers!
- For future growth, we need to look for 1 parent per program to help on a committee to encourage program-by-program participation. Ideally, this will be a sophomore or junior parent. We are excited to have had 3 middle school families volunteer so far. Our program kids are generally pretty excited to help out, especially with their friends. When asking always say "please."

24% orchestra.

- Shelly is working with other concessions leaders/schools to standardize costs across district concessions
- Major electric issues are occurring in the concession stand. We are blowing fuses daily and power is in the wrong places. Shelly is talking with maintenance to hopefully correct the problem over winter.
- Feeding the band students is getting more difficult. Due to the size of the band we are finding that they are not all getting through the line during 3rd quarter (21 last week).
  Additionally, we are wasting unwanted hotdogs after halftime performances (@ 50). We need to consider other options for feeding the band:
  - going to a token system where students can pick between a hotdog or pretzel,

- take google form preorder on Thursday to get numbers for "delivery" to band
- Student section only/band concessions tent
- Equipment:
  - Thank you to Kelly Bull for getting the popcorn machine fixed. The return on investment is approximately 7 years. We need a plan to start replacing key pieces of equipment (grills, etc.). We have purchased 2 additional card readers this year to keep up with demand.

## Costs:

- 39% beverage cost
- 40-50% food cost is goal
- 41% average food cost (not paper)
